# Re: Year 11 November Mock Examinations.

Thank you for your continued support with your son/ daughter this year. The period 6 sessions for English, Maths and Science are going strong with a host of fantastic learning opportunities: all in addition to the timetabled lessons for these subjects. The students that are attending are making good progress in their knowledge and examination techniques, ready for the end of the year.

Period 6 will not be running on the PD week Monday 30<sup>th</sup> October 2023 – Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> November due to both staff and students attending trips and this week being a curriculum collapsed week. There are specialist sessions for English, Mathematics and Science during this week that are directly tied to examinations and GCSE progress. Maths and English will be conducting walking talking mocks a widely used very successful strategy for teaching examination technique. Science will be conducting experiments that are part of the Science GCSE papers, questions will be asked on these practical skills and firsthand experience is of paramount importance for being successful in these questions.

From Monday, 6<sup>th</sup> November your child will be sitting mock examinations in selected subjects including English, Maths and Science over a two-week period. This will be the first of two mock examination periods that the year 11's will sit prior to the final examinations.

These examinations are important as they are an opportunity for your child to experience an examination series similar to the final examinations and identify strengths and areas where knowledge is not yet embedded. It will also give a good indication of the progress that has been made so far this year.

During the mock examinations it is important that all students are fully prepared with their revision and equipment. It is also important that your child's attend every examination. As will be the case in the final exams, if a mock is missed due to non-attendance that paper will receive a score of 0. The results of these exams will act as evidence to assist decision making regarding higher and foundation tiers for the final examinations. They may also influence the setting in some subjects due the focused revision that will be happening because of analysis from these examinations.

Note: - Students with a toilet pass will not be permitted to leave the exam to use the toilet, aside from an emergency: this is in line with the guidance provided to us by the exam boards.

After the exam has finished, students will be dismissed in silence from the rooms as per Exam Board guidance. They will immediately return to their timetabled lesson. Students are expected to return to lessons swiftly. Students who do not return to the correct lesson after their examination will be truanting. We will treat this truancy in line with our policy.

#### Subject Paper Content.

#### **English**

Through the November mock examinations, the English department are offering our students a realistic but carefully considered firsthand experience of sitting their English GCSEs. We recognise how demanding and rigorous GCSE English is and therefore have carefully considered which aspects of the GCSE they will sit; we have designed the mock examinations with this in mind. For GCSE English Language, students will complete *Paper 1: Explorations in Creative Reading and Writing*. Students are assessed against both reading and writing skills which they have developed throughout their time at Plympton Academy. Students should revise the writing frames taught by class teachers last year. For the GCSE English Literature course, students will sit a *Paper 1: Shakespeare and the 19th-Century-Novel* mock examination. Therefore, students will answer exam questions on *A Christmas Carol and Romeo and Juliet*. Our Year 11 students have benefitted from having bespoke English Language and English Literature teachers, who have prepared our learners for this challenge. We strongly encourage that students are familiar with the key characters; plot; themes and most memorable moments from both texts thus far. We believe students are ready to put their knowledge and skills into practice.

#### Mathematics

The Mathematics course is examined by selecting topics from across the course into any of the three papers. This means that any of the topics could be questions on any of the papers. There is also the chance that a topic may come up on two of the three papers as the exam board want to examine both calculator and non-calculator versions of the topic.

This means that over the two papers sat in this series there could be a question on any of the content. The first paper will be non-calculator and the second paper will be calculator. The best way to explore the maths topics is by using the independent learning section on Sparx and changing the curriculum to GCSE. This will have videos and questions on all topics to help you bring some of the topics you studied last year to the forefront of your memory.
