Why homework?



Studies suggest that students who complete regular homework that reviews classroom learning are up to **10 times more likely** to achieve good GCSE and A Level grades .

Our approach to homework is based on retrieval practice. It is designed to provide opportunities for you to regularly **process, memorise and recall** your learning so that you develop independent learning skills and long-term retention of information.

As students move towards their GCSEs, homework becomes more bespoke and exams-focussed.

Completing homework



- \star All homework is set on Classcharts
- ★ Each piece of homework should take 20 minutes to complete (except Maths which is 40 minutes)
- ★ Homework timetables are in the back of the Core Knowledge Organiser
- \star The following homework is set using online platforms:
 - Bedrock (Literacy)
 - Hegarty (Maths)
 - Seneca (All Sciences)
 - Language Gym (Spanish)

Checking homework



- ★ Each piece of homework will have an individual deadline set on Classcharts.
 Homework will be checked by your tutor or teacher
- ★ Your tutor will check your:
 - Bedrock homework (online)
- ★ Your teacher will check your:
 - \circ All other homework

If you have a **genuine** reason why you haven't completed your homework, you need to speak to the person marking it off first (in person or via email **on the day it is due in**)

They will then contact your Head of Year to discuss whether it is a genuine reason.
