STRUCTURE

This is a **two year course** and each year will consist of an exam and an assignment unit.

Exam units will start each September and are normally sat at the end of January/start of February. If a resit is required, you will have a second chance in May.

Assignment units will run from beginning of February till end of June each year (slightly earlier in Year 13)

Human Lifespan

- → Investigate the impacts of different factors on our development/health/wellbein g
- → Argue if aging does always have a negative impact on our development or is it a time to rekindle a healthy wellbeing

- → Examine principles and values needed to ensure equality and effective care to meet individual needs
- → Argue with different ethical theories to justify actions of care workers
- → Investigate multiple ways of overcoming challenges which service users may face

Unit 5 Meeting Individual Care and Support Needs Year 12

Unit 2 Working in Health and Social care Year 13

1.5 hr exam 80 marks

Four sections, each is based on a different short scenario briefly explaining the situation of a person with care needs. Each section of the paper is structured with questions of 2, 4, 6 and 8 marks.

Unit 14 Physiological Disorders Year 13

Assignment (A FIRST submission and then a RESUB is required)

Applying knowledge and understanding of two chosen disorders of your liking and develop a Health Care Plan
