

- At A level, we offer an exciting A Level Literature course that allows you to study new literature from across the world, and throughout time.
- It is a rigorous course, but also really interesting, diverse and applicable to real life.
- You will study literature through the themes of love with texts such as 'Othello' and 'The Great Gatsby' and also explore modern texts linked by themes of conflict and feminism through 'The Handmaid's Tale' and 'Feminine Gospels.'

'The Great Gatsby': F. Scott Fitzgerald 'The Handmaid's Tale': Margaret Atwood






The Structure of the course:
