

# Work for students self-isolating

## Instructions:

- **On the first day of self-isolation** - if the Academy is notified of absence due to self-isolation before 0840, students will be able to access live-streamed lessons from Period 2. During Period 1, they should complete homework-style self-quizzing activities using the Knowledge Organiser for their Period 1 lesson.
- For each subsequent lesson, students should enter the Google Classroom for that subject, where they will find a Google Meet link at the top of the homepage.
- Once the link is clicked, students will enter a waiting room where they will wait to be admitted by the teacher. If the teacher is not yet ready, a message will appear. Students should continue to try the link until they are admitted.
- Students will be able to see the teacher's whiteboard and hear the teacher talking; other students in the class will not be able to see the self-isolating students. Please remember to turn the microphone off before entering the Google Meet so that the class is not disrupted.
- Students who are self-isolating will be able to communicate with the teacher using the Chat function - again, other students in the classroom will not be able to see these messages.

On occasion, there may be unforeseen circumstances (e.g. technology issues) which means that the student cannot join the live Google Meet lesson. Therefore, if students have not been admitted to the lesson within fifteen minutes, they should complete homework-style self-quizzing activities using the Knowledge Organiser for that lesson. In such cases, please email the teacher to let them know that this has been the case.

It will not be possible to live-stream all lessons for the following subject areas due to the required resources and equipment: Sport, Art, Performing Arts, Design and Technology, Catering and Computer Science. For these subjects, students should refer to the *Work for Students Self Isolating* folder in that subject's Google Classroom where work will be available.

There may be instances where students are unable to complete the work because of extreme symptoms and we would ask that you let the Academy know through the Pastoral team that this is the case so that teachers can be notified.

We appreciate that not all students will have laptops and computers - where this is the case the lessons should be accessible on their mobile phones (Google Classroom and Slides are available as apps).
