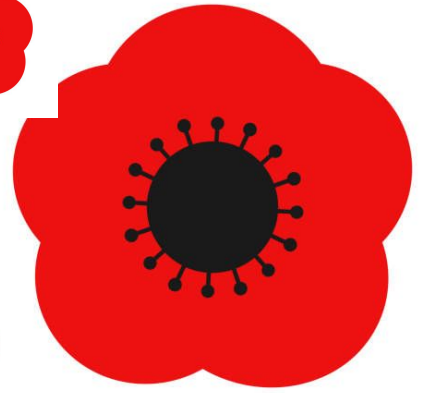

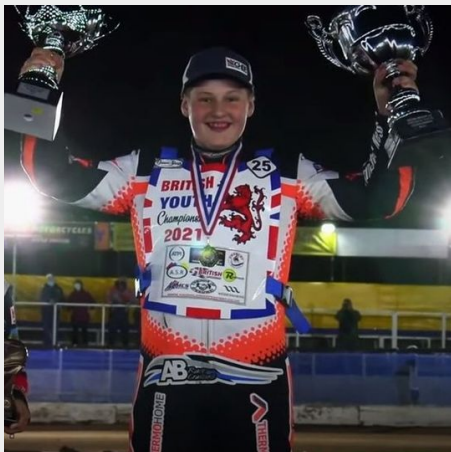

Thank you to the school and staff for supporting Ben with this activity as it means so much to him.

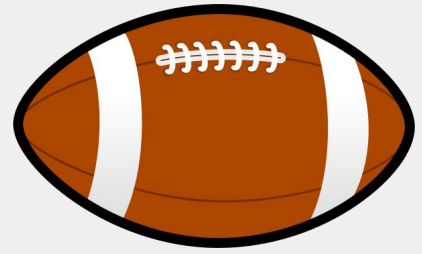
