Also, I'd recommend buying a Spanish dictionary if you can. The unabridged, or big one, costs around £28 [here](#), which is most appropriate for A Level, but is very expensive. The condensed one, such as [this one](#), will cost around £4, or £8 if you buy [this one](#) with grammar explanations included. Just bear in mind, both of these versions won't contain every word so you may not always be able to find what you need.
